## October 2021 Newsletter



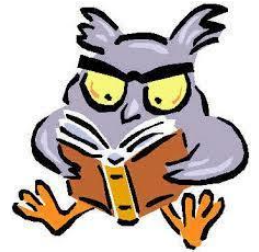
I am really pleased how quickly the children settled at the start of the new academic year and how hard they have all been working.
